The Choir School at St. Peter's is an outreach of St. Peter's Episcopal Church to the city of Charlotte, NC. Children audition for this music education program based in the Anglican tradition. Their participation is not restricted by race, ethnic background, religious affiliation or economic differences. During a regular season, choristers lead worship services and offer a regular series of concerts, as well as study music theory and vocal techniques. Beyond music, the program focuses on leadership, commitment, excellence and service. St James is only one stop on their June tour this year. #### THURSDAY, JUNE 25 | 5:15-7:15 PM LET'S TALK ABOUT IT WITH DEAN JOY ROGERS

Hour four of the series chronicles how the Christian movement, as it became separate from nascent Judaism, would face new challenges—both internal and external. In the period between 100 and 300 CE, the Christian movement grew throughout the Roman Empire. At times, there were heated debates about beliefs, worship and even about Jesus himself. The Christian movement also faced external threats; it became suspicious in the eyes of the Roman authorities, and Christians were persecuted.
