Welcome to St. James Cathedral!

We are glad to welcome you to St. James Cathedral. We are following the Center for Disease Control and City of Chicago guidelines for the COVID-19 pandemic, and so:

- For those who are **fully vaccinated**, wearing masks and social distancing is **highly recommended** while indoors. For those who are **not fully vaccinated**, wearing masks and social distancing is required.
- The side pews are set aside for those who wish to continue to be masked and socially distanced in worship.
- While we will resume offering the Peace physically, this is not an obligation. It is still acceptable to pass the Peace by a gesture if you do not feel comfortable with physical interaction at this point.
- For the time being, Communion will continue to be served in one kind (the bread) at standing stations instead of the altar rail.
- Congregational singing is allowed and encouraged! The choir and liturgical leaders have all been vaccinated and will remove their masks when singing or speaking in the service. The choir will only remove their masks while in the choir loft.

HOLY COMMUNION

We offer God's gracious gift of Holy Communion to anyone who wishes to receive it. During this time communion will be received in one kind (the bread). Let the priest know if you would need a gluten-free wafer. If you prefer to receive a blessing, come forward and cross your arms over your chest. We are also happy to bring Communion to you if you are unable to come to the altar rail. Please let the usher know if this would be helpful for you.

PARKING

On Sundays, reduced-rate parking is available at R.O.W. Parking Garage (50 E. Ohio) for \$2 for up to six hours from the time of entering the garage. Discounts are also available for all-day parking at Ohio Ontario Self Park (33 W. Ontario) for \$11. To receive a reduced-rate parking voucher, please go to the Welcome Center desk in the narthex.
