St. James Cathedral's opportunity to preserve the Commons for the diocese represents a profound moment to reinvigorate the building's original vocation: a hub for diocesan ministry and Episcopal life, a campus to host events that gather the entire diocesan community, and a convening place for our Chicago community.

Please be seated as the Bishop reads the Letter of Institution and asks

Lisa, will you, in the presence of this congregation, commit yourself to this new trust and responsibility?

Dean With the help of God, I will.

Bishop Will you work together with the Chapter and congregation to carry forward the mission and ministry of this Cathedral, boldly proclaiming the word and works of God?

Dean With the help of God, I will.

Bishop May Almighty God, who has given you the will to undertake these things, give you also the grace and power to perform them. **Amen.**

SEATING

The Bishop leads the new Dean to her stall, and places her there with the following words

In the name of God and the Cathedral Chapter of St. James, I install you Lisa as Dean of this Cathedral Church in the stall symbolic of your office. May the Lord preserve your going out and your coming in, from this time forth for ever more.
Amen.

The Dean kneels for a time of private prayer in the Dean's stall. She then prays aloud

O Lord my God, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof; yet you have called your servant to stand in your house, and to serve at your altar. To you and to your service I devote myself, body, soul, and spirit. Fill my memory with the record of your mighty works; enlighten my understanding with the light of your Holy Spirit; and may all the desires of my heart and will center in what you would have me do. Make me an instrument of your salvation for the people entrusted to my care, and grant that I may faithfully administer your holy Sacraments, and by my life and teaching set forth your true and living Word. Be always with me in carrying out the duties of my ministry. In prayer, quicken my devotion; in praises, heighten my love and gratitude; in preaching, give me readiness of thought and expression; and grant that, by the clearness and brightness of your holy Word, all the world may be drawn into your blessed kingdom. All this I ask for the sake of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

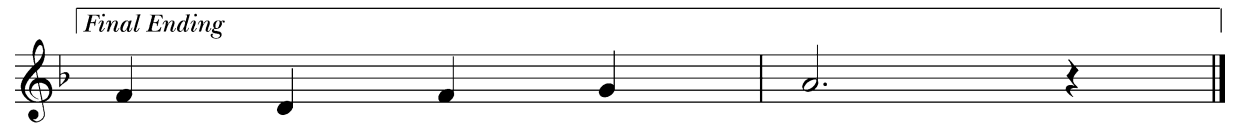
