CHILDREN IN WORSHIP

Children are always welcome here, and this service is designed to actively engage them in worship. There is an open space to the front right of the pews for children 5 and under to play under your supervision and a changing station for parents of our youngest members under the church in the restrooms.

HOLY COMMUNION

We offer God's gracious gift of Holy Communion to anyone who wishes to receive it. If you prefer to receive a blessing, come forward and cross your arms over your chest. Let the priest or minister know if you would need a gluten-free wafer or alcohol-free wine. We are also happy to bring Communion to you if you are unable to come to the altar rail. Please let a priest know if this would be helpful for you.

PARKING

On Sundays, reduced-rate parking is available at R.O.W. Parking Garage (50 E. Ohio) for \$2 for up to six hours from the time of entering the garage. Discounts are also available for all-day parking at Ohio Ontario Self Park (33 W. Ontario) for \$10. To receive a reduced-rate parking voucher, please go to the Welcome Center desk in the narthex.





Please remain seated.

Presider The candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Presenters I present Holden Ford Rizza Hetzer to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Presider Holden, do you desire to be baptized?

Candidate I do.

EXAMINATION OF THE CANDIDATE

The presider asks the candidate

Presider Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against

God?

I renounce them.

Presider Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the

creatures of God? I renounce them.

Presider Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

I renounce them.

Presider Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

I do.

Presider Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

I do.

Presider Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

I do.

All stand. The presider addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Holden in his life

in Christ?

All We will.

Presider Let us join with Holden who is committing himself to Christ and renew our own

baptismal covenant.

BAPTISMAL COVENANT

Presider Do you believe in God the Father?

All I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Presider Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

All I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son our Lord. He was conceived by the power of

the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the

Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Presider Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

All I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints,

the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Presider Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of the

bread, and in the prayers?

All I will with God's help.

Presider Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and

return to the Lord?

All I will with God's help.

Presider Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

All I will with God's help.

Presider Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

All I will with God's help.

Presider Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of

every human being?

All I will with God's help.

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

The presider pours water over the candidate, saying

Holden Ford, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The presider anoints the candidate with the Oil of Chrism, saying

Holden, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.**

The presider prays for the candidate, saying

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon Holden the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.






Reader Why do we share this bread and wine?






