

Restore. Reimagine. Rebuild.

St. James Cathedral Chicago, founded as a parish in 1834, is a vibrant and growing Episcopal community housed in an historic building. It became the cathedral for the Diocese of Chicago in 1955. Throughout our history we have adapted to meet the needs of a changing congregation, changing neighborhood, and changing world.

We are a Christian community committed to sharing the Good News, fueled by our passion for inspiring liturgy and music, faith formation, building a diverse and multi-generational congregation, and reaching out to our neighbors in need. Every year we provide 10,000 meals to people who are food insecure, organize a summer arts and adventure camp for children from across the city, and raise significant financial support for other outreach organizations.

Beloved by members and visitors alike, our building hosts five hundred events every year, from church services and diocesan events, to concerts, conferences, and tours. Our congregation has grown 60% in the past six years, and continues to add more programs and ministries.

Now the cathedral building needs a complete exterior renovation, evidenced by the

conspicuous nets and steel straps applied to the facade over the past five years. As we approach our third century, we face the challenge of ensuring that the building can sustain our ministries and growth. Our most immediate priorities are to restore the cathedral's stone exterior, replace the roof, restore the chapel and narthex, and commission a new organ to replace a failing instrument.

\$16 Million Goal

St. James Cathedral is embarking on a campaign to raise \$16 million in cash and pledges to undertake these first critical tasks.

Additional fundraising will take place for other elements in further phases. Our **Restore, Reimagine, Rebuild Campaign** will build us an enduring house to serve the needs of our congregation for the rest of the 21st century and well into the next.



We are excited to be part of this historic restoration and renovation project. St. James Cathedral is our church home and the home of all of us in this diocese.

Our building was built in 1875, a few years after the Great Chicago Fire of 1871 destroyed most of an earlier building on the same corner of Wabash and Huron. Only the bell tower and Civil War memorial were saved and incorporated into the new building. Over the years, harsh urban pollution, changing climate conditions, and ordinary weathering have taken a toll on the exterior.

We will restore the stonework, make it beautiful and stable again, and ensure its viability for the rest of this century and well into the next.

The roof is well past its 30-year lifetime, and we will replace it. The stained glass windows are in remarkably good condition, but we need to remove the protective exterior plexi-glass and replace it with a state-of-the-art covering. The gardens to the north and south need special attention, as do the sidewalks and parkways on Wabash and Huron.



The exterior stonework, as well as decorative pieces like the bell tower finial, need repair and cleaning.



St. James is growing and thriving. We've made decisions prayerfully and intentionally. I am happy to do my part as we move forward.



The Restore, Reimagine, Rebuild Campaign provides restoration of several important interior spaces, including **the Narthex, the Civil War Monument, the Bell Tower, and St. Andrew's Chapel.**

The narthex on the West end of the Cathedral contains historic bronze memorial plaques commemorating members of the congregation, including Chicago founding families, and a Civil War monument built to remember the sacrifice of St. James members who lost their lives in that war. The monument, floor, ceiling, vestibule, and lighting will be restored. In the bell tower, we will add stained glass to all the windows and install lighting to illuminate the tower at night from within, creating a beautiful and welcoming neighborhood landmark at the corner of Wabash and Huron Streets.

St. Andrew's Chapel was built in 1912, designed by noted architect Bertram Goodhue, who also designed St. Bartholomew's in New York City and Rockefeller Chapel in Chicago. It is modeled on a medieval Scottish abbey and includes a well-known altarpiece with paintings by the Scottish artist Phoebe Anna Traquair. In recent years, water infiltration has caused major damage to the north wall. We will restore this beloved space.



The bell tower and the beloved St. Andrew's Chapel will be restored.



St. James Cathedral is known for its exceptional music, rooted in the Anglican cathedral organ and choral traditions, with music from the Renaissance to the Twenty-First Century. The Cathedral Choir leads the music for the Sunday 11:00 a.m. service, choral evensongs, and many special services. A chorister program for children was re-established five years ago after a 90-year hiatus.

The cathedral organ plays a particularly significant role.

The current organ was built by the Austin Organ company in 1920, with modifications made in 1961 and the late 1990s. By 2015 the organ was found to be structurally unsound and about half of the pipes were removed and stored. In 2018, an organ committee was formed to explore commissioning a new instrument.

With the help of a well-regarded organ consultant, the committee chose eleven organ builders to consider, made site visits to hear examples of each builder, and narrowed the search to two finalists. We anticipate deciding on the organ builder very soon and are eager to announce the decision.
