#### CHILDREN IN WORSHIP

Children are always welcome at St. James. We also offer nursery care with a changing station for parents of our youngest members. There is an open space to the front right of the pews for children to play under your supervision.

#### HOLY COMMUNION

We offer God's gracious gift of Holy Communion to anyone who wishes to receive it. All are invited to receive the chalice by guiding it to your lips. If you prefer to receive a blessing, come forward and cross your arms over your chest. Let the priest know if you would need a gluten-free wafer. We are also happy to bring Communion to you if you are unable to come to the altar rail. Please let a priest know if this would be helpful for you.

#### **PARKING**

On Sundays, reduced-rate parking is available at R.O.W. Parking Garage (50 E. Ohio) for \$2 for up to six hours from the time of entering the garage. Discounts are also available for all-day parking at Ohio Ontario Self Park (33 W. Ontario) for \$10. To receive a reducedrate parking voucher, please go to the Welcome Center desk in the narthex.



**SERMON**

Please stand.

NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

#### **GREAT THANKSGIVING**

For with your co-eternal Son and Holy Spirit, you are one God, one Lord, in Trinity of Persons and in Unity of Being; and we celebrate the one and equal glory of you, O Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

#### Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him.

Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

Amen.

ADVENT PROCESSION on Sunday, November 27 at 6:30 p.m. This traditional service of scripture, anthems, and carols on the first Sunday of Advent moves from darkness to light as a reminder of the hope we look for in the coming of Christ.

NINE LESSONS & CAROLS on Wednesday, Dec. 21 at 6:30 p.m. Familiar carols, lesser-known melodies, and new holiday classics are the musical highlight of Nine Lessons & Carols. Made famous by King's College Chapel, Cambridge, the Festival was introduced to bring a more imaginative approach to worship. Prelude of music for Advent and Christmas at 6 p.m.

CHRISTMAS EVE CHILDREN'S PAGEANT on Saturday, Dec. 24 at 4 p.m. The cathedral youth present the Christmas story during this family-friendly Christmas Eve celebration. Congregational carols are led by the Cathedral Choristers.

CHRISTMAS EVE MIDNIGHT MASS on Saturday, Dec. 24 at 11 p.m. (choral prelude at 10:30 p.m.) Bishop Paula Clark preaches and presides at Midnight Mass, the church's principal celebration of the joyful feast of Christmas with music provided by the Cathedral Choir.

CHRISTMAS DAY on Sunday, Dec. 25 at 11 a.m. There will be one service on Christmas Day commemorating the birth of Jesus with congregational carols and Holy Eucharist.

EVENSONG FOR EPIPHANY on Sunday, Jan. 8 at 4 p.m. (prelude at 3:30 p.m.) The Feast of Epiphany celebrates the revelation of Jesus as Christ to the three wise men from the East, with lullaby-like music to begin the new year.

EVENSONG FOR CANDLEMAS on Sunday, Feb. 5 at 4 p.m. (prelude at 3:30 p.m.) "Candlemas" features a congregational candlelight procession to symbolize Jesus as the light of the world that rounds out the celebrations of Jesus' birth and childhood.
