Lisa, will you, in the presence of this congregation, commit yourself to this new trust and responsibility?

Provost With the help of God, I will.

Bishop Will you work together with the Chapter and congregation to carry forward the mission and ministry of this Cathedral, boldly proclaiming the word and works of God?

Provost With the help of God, I will.

Bishop May Almighty God, who has given you the will to undertake these things, give you also the grace and power to perform them. **Amen.**

INSTALLATION

The Bishop continues, saying

I have instituted Lisa as Provost of this cathedral, and I seat her in her stall, in the presence of this congregation, and pledge to support her in her ministry.

The Bishop leads the new Provost to her stall, and places her there with the following words

Lisa, I place you in the stall of the Provost of the Cathedral Church of St. James. Pray for its members, lead them in worship and service, and encourage them in their witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

SECOND READING

A Reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans. (12:1-18)

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, on the basis of God's mercy, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your reasonable act of worship. Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of the mind, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.

For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the encourager, in encouragement; the giver, in sincerity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness. Let love be genuine; hate what is evil; hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal; be ardent in spirit; serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope; be patient in affliction; persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; pursue hospitality to strangers.

Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice; weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be arrogant, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all.

Hear us, O Christ.



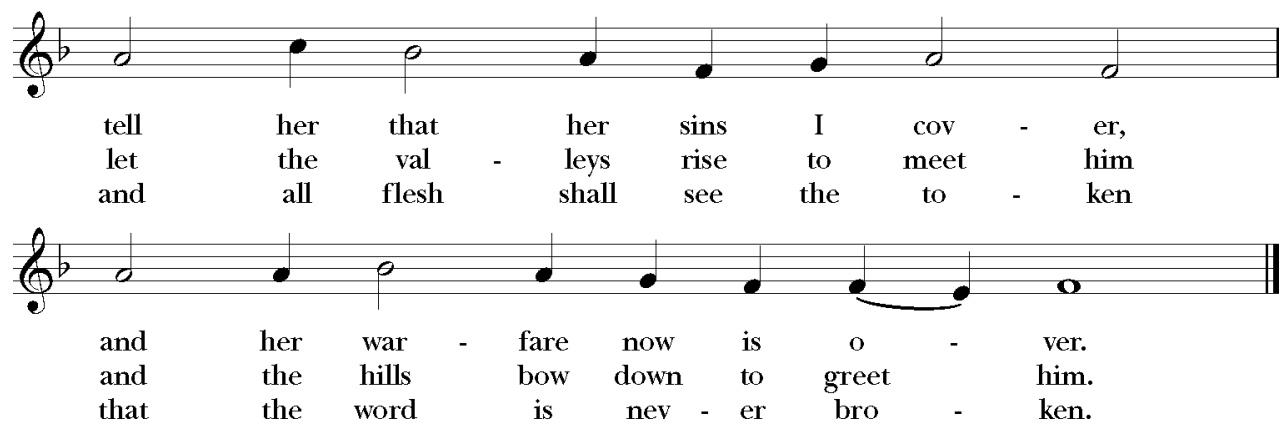
