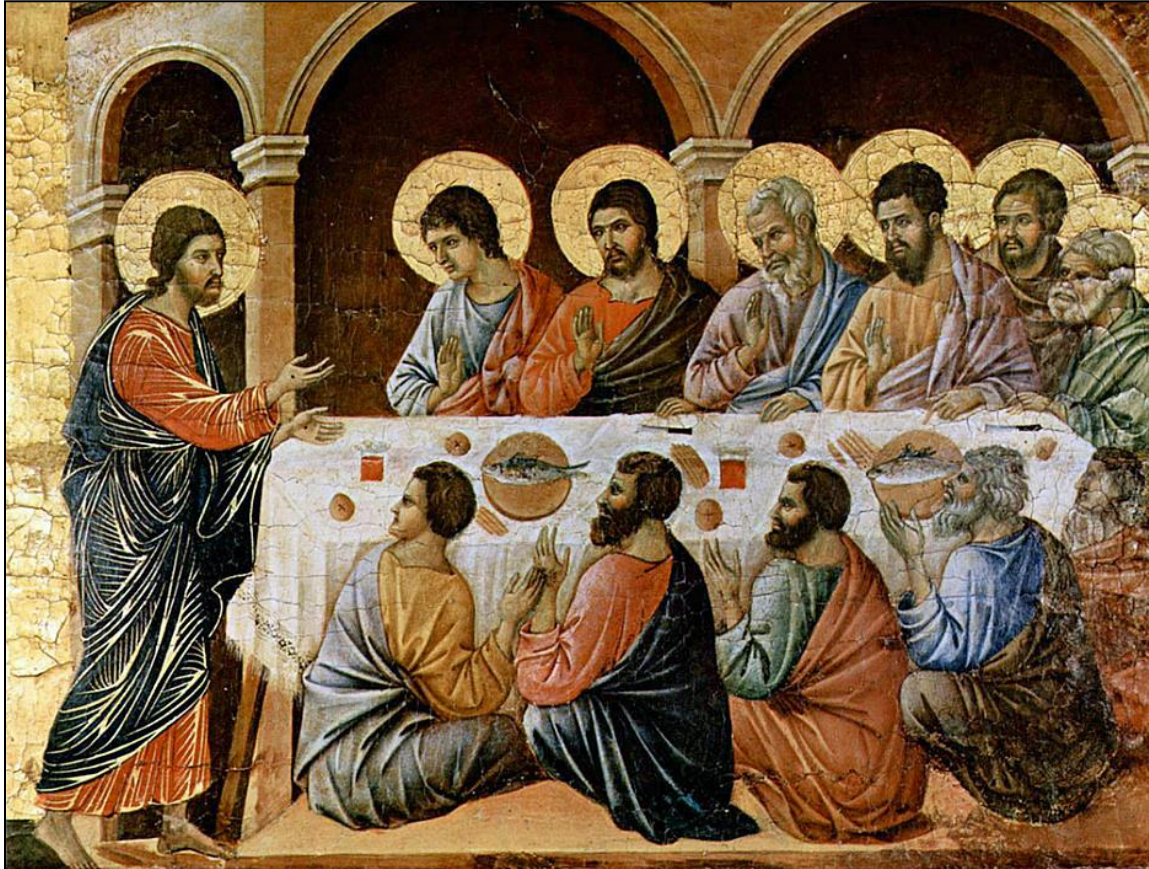

## CHILDREN IN WORSHIP

There is an open space to the front right of the pews for children 5 and under to play under your supervision and a changing station for parents of our youngest members under the church in the restrooms.

We offer God's gracious gift of Holy Communion to anyone who wishes to receive it. If you prefer to receive a blessing, come forward and cross your arms over your chest. Let the priest or minister know if you would need a gluten-free wafer. We are also happy to bring Communion to you if you are unable to come to the altar rail. Please let an usher know if this would be helpful for you.

## PARKING

On Sundays, reduced-rate parking is available at R.O.W. Parking Garage (50 E. Ohio) for \$2 for up to six hours from the time of entering the garage. Discounts are also available for all-day parking at Ohio Ontario Self Park (33 W. Ontario) for \$11. To receive a reduced-rate parking voucher, please go to the welcome table in the narthex or the reception desk in the Welcome Center.







# Liturgy of the Word

## FIRST READING

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles. (16:23b–27a, 29–34a)

Paul and Silas were put in jail, and the jailer was told to guard them carefully. The jailer did as he was told. He put them deep inside the jail and chained their feet to heavy blocks of wood. About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing praises to God, while the other prisoners listened. Suddenly a strong earthquake shook the jail to its foundations. The doors opened, and the chains fell from all the prisoners. When the jailer woke up and saw that the doors were open, he thought that the prisoners had escaped. The jailer asked for a torch and went into the jail. He was shaking all over as he knelt down in front of Paul and Silas. After he had led them out of the jail, he asked, “What must I do to be saved?” They replied, “Have faith in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved! This is also true for everyone who lives in your home.” Then Paul and Silas told him and everyone else in his house about the Lord. While it was still night, the jailer took them to a place where he could wash their cuts and bruises. Then he and everyone in his home were baptized. They were very glad that they had put their faith in God. After this, the jailer took Paul and Silas to his home and gave them something to eat.

## PRESENTATION OF THE BAPTISMAL CANDIDATE

*Please remain seated.*

*Presider* The candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*Presenters* We present Eve Janet Grindley to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*The parents and godparents are asked on behalf of the candidate,*

*Presider* Parents and godparents, will you be responsible for seeing that Eve is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

*Presenters* I will, with God's help.

*Presider* Will you by your prayers and witness help her to grow into the full stature of Christ?

*Presenters* I will, with God's help.

## EXAMINATION OF THE CANDIDATE

*Please remain seated. The presider asks the parents and godparents*

*Presider* Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

I renounce them.

*Presider* Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

I renounce them.

*Presider* Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

I renounce them.

*Presider* Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

I do.

*Presider* Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

I do.

*Presider* Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

I do.

*All stand. The presider addresses the congregation, saying*

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Eve in her life in Christ?

*All* **We will.**

*Presider* Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

## BAPTISMAL COVENANT

*Presider* Do you believe in God the Father?

*All* **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

*Presider* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

*All* **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

*Presider* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*All* **I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

*Presider* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of the bread, and in the prayers?

*All* **I will with God's help.**

*Presider* Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

*All* **I will with God's help.**

*Presider* Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

*All* **I will with God's help.**

*Presider* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

*All* **I will with God's help.**

*Presider* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

*All* **I will with God's help.**

## PRAYERS

*Presider* Let us now pray for Eve who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.  
*Leader* Deliver her, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.  
*All* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Open her heart to your grace and truth.  
*All* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Fill her with your holy and life-giving Spirit.  
*All* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Keep her in the faith and communion of your holy Church.  
*All* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Teach her to love others in the power of the Spirit.  
*All* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Send her into the world in witness to your love.  
*All* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Bring her to the fullness of your peace and glory.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon Eve the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

Let us welcome the newly baptized.
