improving the technical & programmatic functionality of our liturgical space for both liturgical & nonliturgical uses/programs

- EXISTING ORGAN IN CRITICAL DISREPAIR
- LACK OF SUITABLE/FLEXIBLE SPACE FOR CURRENT OR WOULD-BE USES & PROGRAMS
- LACK OF DOORWAY WIDTH AT THE EXISTING CATHEDRAL-COMMONS LINK IMPEDING FUNCTIONALITY (E.G. FOR THE PASSAGE OF CASKETS)
- ENHANCING OR RESOLVING KNOWN ISSUES PERTAINING TO INTERIOR LIGHTING, SPATIAL ACOUSTICS, AUDIO-VIDEO/LIVESTREAM SYSTEMS, ETC.

RENOVATED SANCTUARY

- Existing High Altar (1962) relocated & reconfigured to allow west/Congregant-facing celebration of the Eucharist (per current liturgical practice); fixes & grounds the space as sacred even when, e.g., Forward Altar is removed to accommodate nonliturgical uses & programs
- 2 Existing Robert H. Clarkson Memorial Reredos (1884) to remain


RENOVATED & EXTENDED CHANCEL


- 3 New Forward Altar modular & movable to accommodate a range of uses/programs
- **4 Reinstated Antiphonal Chancel Choir** *two pews (with integral choir desks) to each side, each pew with room for at least nine adults*
- **6** New Movable Organ Console
- **6** Existing Pulpit (1875) & Lectern (1875) relocated, with Pulpit raised 10"–14" to enhance liturgical stature for proclamation of the Word
- New Ramp for accessibility, piano-moving, etc.
 TRANSEPTS
- 8 Lofted gallery floor area released for new uses with restoration of Choir to Chancel
- Existing Howard S. Kennedy Memorial Organ Pipes (1962) to remain
- Existing Organ Chamber & Case (1875) historically significant Case refurbished & Chamber reconfigured for Walker Organ pipes
- Existing Cathedral-Commons Link renovated & widened to afford dignified liturgical use & general public passage

12 NAVE

Existing Pews & Pew Cushions to be refurbished / replaced as required

Flooring, Lighting, and Audio/Visual improvements for enhanced acoustics & overall interior environment in support of liturgical & nonliturgical uses/programs





EXISTING SANCTUARY

- 1 Existing High Altar (1962) designed for eastfacing celebration of the Eucharist (i.e. Clergy facing away from Congregants) — insufficient footpace along the Altar's east side makes west/ Congregant-facing celebration (of current liturgical practice) challenging & treacherous
- Existing Robert H. Clarkson Memorial Reredos (1884)
- 3 Existing Forward Altar modular & movable, allowing space to effectively accommodate a range of programs & uses; enables west/Congregantfacing Eucharistic celebrations that are precluded by the High Altar as currently configured
- Existing Octagonal Platform (1962) defines, elevates, and sets apart the Sanctuary as sacred but greatly constrains the portion of the Cathedral's focal space that is flexible, as demanded by current/would-be uses & programs
- **5** Existing Grand Piano routine need to be moved from many-tiered Chancel / Sanctuary entails great difficulty & significant expense

EXISTING CHANCEL

6 Existing Pulpit (1875) & Lectern (1875)

 Stair-only access to raised Chancel hinders accessibility for people with disabilities
 TRANSEPTS

- 8 Choir & Organ Console relocation to loft during prior Reconfiguration (1962) for newfound designation as Cathedral is a break from St James' historical custom & broader Anglican tradition, resulting in a disembodied connection between Congregants and the Choir that serves to support our communal worship
- **Existing Organ Chamber & Case (1875)** *historically significant Case conceals a myriad of critical issues with existing Organ within*
- Existing Cathedral-Commons Link lack of width & existing fittings/finishes are unbefitting of liturgical & nonliturgical uses
